### **Nursery Newsletter**

This week we are going to be.....

continuing with a little work based on Goldilocks. The week will begin with the acting out of the story with some quite marvellous cameos from members of staff. Once the staff have acted it out, the children are given the opportunity to have a go. This is a fun way of introducing the Literacy strands to the children encouraging them to remember repeated phrases from the story as well as helping them sequence the story in the correct order. We have had some wonderful acting in the past and look forward to seeing who is going to give it a go this year.

We shall be making porridge with the children introducing them to measurements as we mix the ingredients before cooking them. The children are then going to be tasting it which always gets a mixed reaction.

Using the idea of the Three Bears' kitchen, we will be looking at children's knowledge of positional language as we get them to replace different items using language such as underneath, behind, inside, on top of etc.

To encourage children's patience and ability to wait, we shall be playing a memory game. A number of items are placed on a tray and the children have to look at the objects and memorise which are there. They are covered with a cloth, the items, not the children, and one of the items is removed. The children have to wait until their turn is indicated when they can say which they think has been removed.

PE continues for morning and afternoon children on a Friday. The children have loved playing with the large parachute in our sessions over the past few weeks.

It may be worth having a quick check of your children's hair over the weekend as there have been some sightings of nits which spread quickly and are very difficult to get rid of.

In the morning, some parents have to get in and out of the classroom quickly to drop other children off in other parts of the school. They would be grateful if all corridors and doorways are kept relatively clear so they can get them to their classes on time.
