Think about what will make your bridge strong for the heavy troll. It must be tall enough and wide enough to cross the river. *Using junk model materials or construction such as Lego, Duplo, wooden bricks, build your bridge. Test your bridges strength by adding weight to the top of it, how much weight will it take before it breaks?</p>
