Can you explore materials you have in your home such as tinfoil, bin bag, carrier bag, tea towel, cling film, tissue paper, kiten roll, felt, wood. Sprinkle some water on them and see what happens. Make a list.          *Draw a map of the woods to get to Grandma's house for the focus story this week: "Little Red Riding Hood". The map should include Little Red Riding Hood's house, Grandma's house, forest features i.e. trees, bushes, flowers, the wolf, and a path to get there. Add labels to your map.</p>	<p>* An important day in American history is July 4<sup>th</sup>- Independence day. What does it mean to be independent? How are you independent? Find out what Independence day is all about. How do they celebrate the festival?          * What does freedom mean? Find out with your grown-up. What freedom do you have?</p>	<p>*Make a wolf mask from materials around your home- it could be on a paper plate or cut out from cardboard. Use your mask to act out the story maybe dress up like Grandma.          *Design and make a basket, or someway to carry items to Grandma's house. Can you make it Wolf proof!</p>
