Place a small amount of water into a re-sealable bag and tape it to the window. You could add some blue food colouring if you like to make it easier to see. Leave in a sunny spot and observe what happens over time as the water warms up and evaporates, then cools and condenses, falling back down just like rain in the water cycle.There are lots of dandelions about at the moment, but before you pull them up, they are a great source of food for bees! Can you take a picture or draw a diagram of the dandelion every day to see how the dandelions change over time?

Year 5 Maths Everywhere – Watery estimation



Use different cups, glasses, containers and bottles.

Most bottles have their capacity (how much they will hold) written on them for example, 1 litre, 750ml, 500ml, 250ml etc.

Estimate how many different cups or containers you would have to use to fill a range of bottles and then try it to out find how close your estimate was to the actual amount. You can then work out the capacity of each container, for example, if it took four cups to fill a one litre bottle then the cup holds 250ml.

Estimate and try out how many different size bottles in would take to fill a bowl, a kettle, a bucket, a bath, etc.
