

Who? Haiku

A syllable is part of a word pronounced as a unit. It is usually made up of a vowel alone or a vowel with one or more consonants. The word 'syllable' has three syllables.

Haiku poems consist of 3 lines made up of 17 syllables.

I am first with five, **(5 syllables)**

Then seven in the middle, **(7 syllables)**

Five again to end. **(5 syllables)**

Haiku poems can act almost as riddles. Try to figure out what the 2 Haiku poems are about:

Green and speckled legs, Hop on logs and lily pads Splash in cool water.	In a pouch I grow, On a southern continent -- Strange creatures I know.
